



Rescue Diver

Having completed your entry-level and advanced training, you may now wish to take your diver training to the next stage. The Rescue Diver course will teach you self reliance as well as awareness of others so that you will be capable and prepared to manage a diving accident in the unlikely event a problem does arise.

The Rescue Diver course makes the subject of accident prevention and management enjoyable and rewarding and opens up a whole new perspective in the diving world.

What form will the course take?

The theory part of the Rescue Diver course includes:

- 1) Self rescue and stress management
- 2) First aid equipment and procedures
- 3) Managing an Emergency
- 4) Equipment function and potential problems.

The practical part of the course teaches candidates how to foresee, prevent and manage potential diving accidents. Several emergency scenarios are handled including rescuing responsive and unresponsive divers both at the surface and underwater.

The Course Schedule

The course runs over two days, usually at a weekend. Please check with an Instructor at In Depth Diving for the next scheduled course dates.

What qualifications do I need?

You must be a PADI Advanced Open Water Diver or equivalent and at least 15 years of age. A valid First Aid and CPR qualification is also required such as the PADI Medic First Aid course.

Course Fee

The course costs £250 and includes tuition fees and the Rescue Diver manual. Equipment rental and transportation costs to dive sites are not included in the price.
